Depending on your interest/expertise, here are some of the things you could work on:

(1st, 2nd or summer term co-op placements available! Online co-op placements also possible!)

- Do simple bike maintenance and repair (you will be trained to do this ***in partnership with our sister project, Recycle Cycles!***)
- Help our bikeshare team install new stations (technical and IT components)
- Organize and assist with IT issues, including database management, website maintenance, figuring out solutions to IT challenges (Research a bikeshare app? Build a different bikeshare map?)
- Help us think through new projects and ideas (Research a better bike? A smart lock? Build a trailer to carry bikes? Suggest new station locations?)
- Work with our bikeshare team on our social & traditional media strategy
- Work on design for flyers, posters
- Support our bikeshare members
- Represent the bikeshare at events
- Conduct research, contribute to reports
- Contribute to the day-to-day running of the bikeshare

You'll get:

- Free Bike safety and bike maintenance training (a great thing for your resume!)
- Free 1-year Community Access Bikeshare membership
- Bike parking provided 😊
- First-hand experience in one of the region's busiest social enterprises
- Ongoing professional development and mentorship opportunities (in-house and external)
