





A TIMELINE OF COMMUNITY SUPPORT

JANUARY 1985 First meal is served at St. John's Church



1989250 people per day areserved – 60 000 a year



1990 Gretchen starts volunteering, and is hired soon after





1991 Establishes it's own funding for providing a daily meal and supports

1999 Arleen retires after 11 years of being co-ordinator; Jennifer starts





2006Move to newly renovated97 Victoria Street North

2018 Each day over 400 meals are served; with shower, laundry, medical, and basic needs provided



There are currently 130+ volunteers supporting the St. John's Kitchen community





